The College is fortunate to be growing and increasing in student number on a weekly basis, so much so that our Waiting List in many instances cannot accommodate new families wishing to enrol their children. To accommodate this, the College is undertaking a Building Plan with an approval to commence Stage 1 projects for a new facility on site that will house a new Learning Resource Centre, an Administration Centre and 8 additional classrooms at the commencement of this December. The expected construction will take place in the vacant land behind the temporary fences and extend to include the area currently with the two houses (Office & Library).

It has been planning this now for the past two years and approval was finally forwarded by our Departmental Federal Authorities in May. However, over the past 3 years, we have been able to utilize additional classrooms and created additional classes for Primary with and additional Yr 3/4 (2016), an additional Yr 2 (2017) and this year plan to further assist our Waiting List families in Years 1 & 2 with a new class that will be introduced for the commencement of Term 3 2018. The expected growth will soon see SMC Primary with a full two-stream Primary School by 2020 once Stage 1 Building Project has been completed.

Stage one classes will consist of two x Yr 1 classes and two x Yr 2 classes. The classes are mixed ability as the teacher's programs allow for differentiation to cater for all students of different abilities.

We have been blessed to employ Miss Monica Armanyos as the new Yr 1 classroom teacher for this new class who commences her duties on 23 July 2018. Miss Monica Armanyos comes with some great experiences and she is an active member of her community. She is a wonderful addition to the Primary team and through God's Grace we look forward to the further expansion of the College in the coming years where further building and construction is being planned.

SPIRITUAL CORNER from our College Chaplain – Rev Fr George Nakhil

The Fast of the Apostles is one of the oldest fasts in the church, and was previously known as the "Fast of Pentecost" or the "Fast of the Disciples." However, during the Ecumenical Council of Nicea in 325 A.D., its name was changed to "Fast of the Apostles" which is carried through till today.

In the *Holy Dioscolia* (collected in the third century), it is written: "After you complete the Feast of Pentecost, have a feast for another week... then we fast after the rest." However, in the book *The Canon of the Apostles*, which was one of the books of Clement of Rome (collected in the fourth century), it states: "They continued to speak in the new tongues of the nations, in which they preached, and He told them what must be done by the congregations with regards to prayer, worship, and the laws, and they thanked God for this knowledge they received. They fasted for forty days, thanking God through it, and then Peter washed the feet of the disciples... then they departed to all the nations to call people to the faith."

"The Fast of the saintly Fathers, the Disciples, which is also called 'Fast of Pentecost,' begins with the Monday after the Holy Fifty Days, and it ends on the fourth of Epip, the night that commemorates the martyrdom of the Apostles Peter and Paul..." Currently, this is the accepted opinion of the Coptic Orthodox Church, as well as the Syrian and Greek Orthodox Churches.



From these sources, we find that the Apostles fasted after the descent of the Holy Spirit on them, as well as between the Ascension of the Christ and the Feast of Pentecost. The aim of the fast were different: the fast after the Ascension was because the Apostles were waiting for the gifts of the Holy Spirit, which was promised to them by the Lord of glory. This sort of fasting is also the reason why we fast before communion and baptism, or the fasting of a bishop before his ordination - it prepares us to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. As for Apostles' fast after Pentecost, it was a fast of thanksgiving to God for the gifts of the Holy Spirit that they received, and it served a purpose of preparing them for another service, which was to preach to the world. Thus, service and preaching are an important cornerstone to this fast.

Moreover, the work of the Holy Spirit is clearly seen in the Church. The Church fasts during the week that follows the Feast of Pentecost, but this does not contradict the rules of the Feast, because, as Saint Basil and Saint John Chrysostom say, "to feast is not to break a fast." The same applies to the Feast of the Annunciation, where we do not contravene our fast for the Great Lent. The Feast of Transfiguration, which usually occurs during the Fast of the Virgin, is another occasion where we do not break the fast. We fast during the Minor Feasts of the Lord (the Circumcision Feast, the Feast of the Lord's Entry into the Temple, the Feast of the Lord's Entry to Egypt, the Feast of the Wedding of Cana of Galilee, and Maundy Thursday) if they come on a Wednesday or Friday. We fast as well on some of the feasts of the Virgin Mary and any of the feasts of the martyrs or saints. Hence, breaking the fast does not follow the celebration of Pentecost, but rather we celebrate with fasting, prayer, and thanksgiving.

Accordingly, we can conclude that the Apostles fasted for ten days after the Ascension of Christ, to prepare themselves to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. This accords with the Lord's saying: "*The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast*" (*Mt. 9:15*). On Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit descended with His gifts on the disciples, so they fasted with thanksgiving to God and to prepare themselves for service and preaching. In this way, the disciples did exactly as their Lord, who fasted for forty days after the Holy Spirit descended on Him. This is also evident in the Acts of the Apostles: "While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off. So, being sent out by the Holy Spirit… they proclaimed the word of God" (Acts 13:2-5). Therefore, the Fast of our Fathers, the Apostles, has an important place in our church, since it is related to the work of the Holy Spirit in the believers.

Assessment and Reporting

Assessment and reporting are two important processes in the learning and teaching cycle at St Mark's College. Assessing student learning is an integral part of the school classroom. It improves learning and informs teaching: it is the process through which teachers identify, gather and interpret information about student achievement and learning to improve, enhance and plan for further learning.

The Learning Goals for the first semester are developed after careful observation and rigorous assessment of your child's progress during first term followed by an interview and communicated to the parents. Goals are set focussing on the development of Literacy, Numeracy and/or Behavioural /Organisational skills.





The student portfolio is sent home with your child's mid-year and end of year reports for you to view, share with your child and celebrate their progress. The student portfolio provides valuable insight into your child's achievements and development.

Things to look for in the child's portfolio:

- Evidence of development improvement and progress
- Best work practices and best efforts
- Presentation elements e.g. handwriting
- Content of their work e.g units covered in class
- Evidence of creative thinking in their work
- Signs of "having a go" and risk-taking with their learning

What to do:

- Celebrate your child's achievements
- Look for indicators to focus on for future development
- Communicate with your child's class teacher about the progress shown through the portfolio

Parent / Student / Teacher Interviews will be held twice each year. The first is held in Term 1 and the second is held in term 3. The purpose of the Parent / Student / Teacher Interview is for parents to share relevant information about their child and for the class teacher to share information about their observations and assessments of the student's progress.

The student participates in the interview to share their learning goals for the semester. These goals have been developed by your child's teacher because of extensive assessment and observation of your child at work. Your child has also formulated one of their own learning goals (Years 2-6).
