

Coptic Orthodox Studies aims to lay foundations for teaching and engaging the students to learn about God and the faith of the Coptic Orthodox Church. Through the seasons of the Liturgical Year, students are given the opportunity to actively participate in the celebrations, prayer and liturgical life. Each Coptic Orthodox lesson incorporates values and attitudes such as respect, kindness, love and obedience which are all reflected through the students' life at St. Mark's College.

Term One students in all stages of primary school explored important Christian values through the topic of 'A time to Make Choices'. Key inquiry questions were posed to students to have them think about their current personal values as opposed to the values held by the church. Students understood the power of prayer. As this term coincided with Lent, students also learnt the importance of fasting in growing spiritually and having a relationship with God.

The Term Two topic of "The Holy Spirit Helps Us to Share!" again explored important Christian values of respect, friendship and teamwork. The topic had students contemplate the ways the Holy Spirit can guide their lives and help them make the right decisions. Each stage researched a specific saint and looked at the saint's lives and journey in Christianity. This was explored as a means for students to admire and be inspired to follow the footsteps of the saints.

Term Three had a different focus for each stage. Stage One focused on the topic "Love Means Being Respectful." The key inquiry questions for these students included understanding what respect means, how Christ showed respect and some ways students can show respect. Stage Two focused on the topic "We Grow with God". The main idea of this term was for students in Stage Two to understand and recognise that children are gifts from God and if we obey God's word we grow as Christians.


Stage Three focused on the topic "God Calls Us to His Kingdom". This had students understand that through Christ's virtues of being a preacher, healer and teacher that God was able to show respect, compassion, and love. These are all values that students have demonstrated in their daily lives here at Saint Mark's Coptic Orthodox College.


Term Four also had a different focus for each stage. Stage One continued the theme of what love means through the topic "Love Means Obeying Rules". Students understood the importance that by following rules in church, at home and in the community, we can show our love for God and one another.

Stage Two were introduced to the Bible through the topic "The Bible is the Word of God". Students learnt the importance of the Holy Bible and how to use the Bible.

Stage Three explored the Bible scriptures. They looked in depth at the work of the Apostle St. Peter and St. Paul. They also looked at the contribution of the three great fathers and teachers of the church, Saint Athansios the Great, Basil the Great, and Gregory the Theologian.

This year's programs had been carefully created and designed to instil Christian themes that students can incorporate in their daily lives for years to come.





At Saint Mark's, we are one of just a handful of schools in NSW who managed to hold both a Swimming and Athletics Carnival back in Term 1 with Saint Marina and Saint Anthony as respective winners on the day. Since this very positive start to the year, no other school subject has been affected more than Sport. In this entirely unprecedented situation, almost the entire year of competitive sport in the form of our IPSSO competition for years 3-6, term 4 Swim School and other interschool events such as ASISSA all cancelled. Nevertheless, despite the clear disappointment of being deprived of these opportunities, there have been some subtle silver linings with sporting activity at the college this year. One area that stands out is the ability for teachers to observe, engage and delight in their students' sporting activity in a way that would normally be a rarity to witness first hand.

It reminds us as teachers and students alike of the role physical activity plays in breaking up our professional and academic lives in a way that boosts our spirits, enjoyment of where we are, our energy levels and productivity in all that we do. I would posit that the benefits of this sporting time together are even more far reaching as this sporting activity time has enabled student and teacher to see a range of new and different positive aspects about one another. The adventurous program of House Competitions across a range of sports and co-curricular activities may not have proceeded as planned yet several key house events have gone ahead due to the commitment of our House Captains in setting up and facilitating events. The House point scheme was introduced into Primary this year wherein House Captains collect weekly totals of points collected in class through effort, attainment and great conduct in class. Saint Marina emerged as victors overall this year in a well-contested and close competition.

As we've returned to some semblance of usual sporting activity, the Saint Mark's School spirit we have witnessed this year has been evident in all ages and stages. This is most encouraging as we look to resume our usual agenda of activities next year. On a personal note, it was my goal to promote skill development, engagement and exposure to new activities by working more closely work alongside years Kindergarten – Year 2 this year. The reduction of College participation elsewhere did enable this to happen in age groups with extra time to develop and refine techniques, understanding of rules and tactics; it is my sincere hope the level of enjoyment in our sporting lives in the Primary School will continue to grow, achieve new firsts and targets within and beyond the school premises in 2021. We look forward to the completion of the new Primary building to assist both Primary and High School in achieving these curricular goals.
