

Despite being a short 8 week term, it has been action-packed with exciting projects and activities that have engaged and inspired our students.


#### **Building a PC from Scratch**

It has been rewarding to see our students gain confidence and proficiency in such a crucial area of modern technology.

Next term, we'll be selecting a new group of students for the SRC, and we'll keep you updated on the schedule for next term's speeches. Stay tuned!


